The items listed below are those that the provider was not in compliance with at the time of the inspection.

Compliance Plan Action #1

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:26

A nap mat, blanket, or other sleep surface, other than the floor, for children over one year of age must be available for each child during nap time. A sleep surface must be maintained in good repair. A provider shall follow the safe sleep practices contained in Caring for Our Children: National Health and Safety Performance Standards, 4th Edition, for infants under the age of one.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

During the inspection, a blanket was observed in a crib designated for a child under the age of one. The provider confirmed that the child who sleeps in that crib is under one year old and uses the blanket.

Corrections to be Made:

A provider shall follow the safe sleep practices contained in Caring for Our Children: National Health and Safety Performance Standards, 4th Edition, for infants under the age of one which includes keeping soft objects and loose bedding that increase the risk of entrapment or suffocation out of the infant's sleep area. This includes blankets, pillows, bumper pads, stuffed toys, and sleep positioning devices.

Corrections Made:

Provider immediately removed the blanket from child's sleep environment.

All providers have completed Safe Sleep training and are fully aware of safe sleep requirements.

Compliance Plan Action #2

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:24

Before a child may be admitted to a registered or licensed day care provider, the provider must require the child's parent or guardian to submit a statement, signed by a licensed physician, physician's assistant, certified nurse practitioner, or community health nurse, or an immunization record from the South Dakota Immunization Information System, showing that the child meets the minimum immunization requirements according to 45 C.F.R. §

98.41(a)(1)(i)(A), in effect on September 30, 2016. The provider shall ensure that immunizations of all children are current. For children who begin the series late or are more than one month behind in immunizations, the documentation must show progress toward achieving immunization requirements, as determined by a licensed physician, or other licensed practitioner. A grace period may be approved by the department for a child experiencing homelessness or a child in foster care. A child is exempt from meeting the minimum age-specific immunization levels if: (1) The child's parent or guardian has certification from a licensed physician, or other licensed practitioner, stating that the physical condition of the child is such that an immunization would endanger the child's life or health; or (2) The child's parent or guardian has signed a written statement that the child is an adherent to a religious doctrine whose teachings are opposed to such immunizations. If a child becomes ill while at a day care, the provider must separate the child from other children and notify the child's parents. If any child in the program contracts a communicable disease, the provider must notify the Department of Health. The program provider shall follow the Department of Health's recommendations for addressing a situation involving a communicable disease. To prevent the spread of an infestation or infectious disease, a program shall provide an individual storage unit or container for each child's personal articles.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

At time of inspection, 6 child files were missing immunization records.

Corrections to be Made:

Before a child may be admitted to a registered or licensed day care provider, the provider must require the child's parent or guardian to submit a statement, signed by a licensed physician, physician's assistant, certified nurse practitioner, or community health nurse, or an immunization record from the South Dakota Immunization Information System, showing that the child meets the minimum immunization requirements according to 45 C.F.R. § 98.41(a)(1)(i)(A), in effect on September 30, 2016. The provider shall ensure that immunizations of all children are current.

Corrections Made:

Verifications received indicating missing immunization records have been collected and files are now updated with required information.
