The items listed below are those that the provider was not in compliance with at the time of the inspection.

Compliance Plan Action #1

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:25

All equipment, utensils, kitchenware, dining tables, and food contact surfaces of equipment must be washed, rinsed, and sanitized after each meal. Toys capable of being placed in a child's mouth must be cleaned and sanitized daily, using a solution approved by the department. All providers, program employees, and children shall wash their hands with soap, before preparing food or beverages, eating, handling food, or feeding a child, and after changing a diaper, using the toilet, helping a child use a toilet, or coming into contact with bodily fluid.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Program was using wipes to sanitize toys. Toys must be cleaned and sanitized daily with solution approved by the department.

Corrections to be Made:

Program must use a solution approved by the department. The program had a bleach solution available, and the inspector discussed the requirements during the inspection. The program corrected the issue immediately.

Corrections Made:

Proper cleaning and disinfecting of toys was discussed with the program and the program corrected the issue immediately.

Compliance Plan Action #2

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:44

All toxic or hazardous substances must be:

- (1) Inaccessible to children;
- (2) Used according to manufacturer's instructions;
- (3) Stored in the original or other labeled container; and
- (4) Disposed of according to manufacturer recommendations.

Bio-contaminants must be handled and disposed of properly. Soiled diapers must be changed promptly, in a designated area, on a non-porous surface. The diaper changing area must be clean and disinfected with a sanitizing solution approved by the department. Soiled diapers must be kept in a leakproof, nonabsorbent container that is covered with a

tight-fitting lid.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Bleach solution for diaper changing was not strong enough. Program must ensure that bleach solution is mixed appropriately for sanitizing.

Corrections to be Made:

Program must ensure that bleach solution is mixed correctly, and provide verification of understanding to OLA.

Corrections Made:

Program has a clear understanding of how to appropriately mix the bleach solution and the issue was discussed with OLA.

Compliance Plan Action #3

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:35

Playgrounds for all child care settings must be safe, in good repair, and free of debris, trash, and weeds. Playground equipment must be installed according to the manufacturer's instructions and maintained in good repair. For a center program, a fence that measures at least four feet high is required around the center's outdoor play space. For a family day care or school-age program, a fence that measures at least forty-two inches high may be required to separate the outdoor play space, if the department determines a body of water, vehicular traffic, or other hazard poses a risk of injury or death to a child.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Spiral ladder on playground was broke in two pieces. All playground equipment must be in good repair.

Corrections to be Made:

Ladder must be removed or repaired and verification must be sent to OLA.

Corrections Made:

The spiral ladder on the playground could not be repaired so the program removed it. Verification was provided to OLA.

Compliance Plan Action #4

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:31

An infant shall be fed according to the infant's schedule. The provider shall hold the infant's bottle when feeding the infant. The provider may not feed an infant by propping up the infant's bottle. Food, including breast milk and formula, must be properly stored, kept at the proper temperature, and protected from potential contamination according to the preparing, feeding, and storing standards contained in Caring for Our Children: National Health and Safety Performance Standards, 4th Edition.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Refrigerator temperature was 44 degrees. Temperature must be 41 degrees or lower.

Corrections to be Made:

Refrigerator temperature was adjusted during inspection, and inspector discussed the requirements with the program.

Corrections Made:

Refrigerator temperature was turned down during inspection, and inspector discussed the requirements with the program.


