The items listed below are those that the provider was not in compliance with at the time of the inspection.

Compliance Plan Action #1

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:33

A provider shall meet the following requirements regarding bathrooms:

- (1) Bathroom facilities must be easily accessible by children and providers;
- (2) Hot water for faucets normally used by children in care may not exceed one hundred twenty degrees Fahrenheit;
- (3) Toilets and hand sinks must be kept clean and in good repair; and
- (4) For child care centers and school-age programs:
 - (a) All bathrooms must have natural or mechanical ventilation;
 - (b) Separate bathrooms must be available for males and females;
 - (c) Ratios for toilet and hand sinks must align with the minimum standards for plumbing and plumbing systems published by the plumbing commission.

Except in a family day care, hand sinks must be in the same room, or an unobstructed room adjacent to the diaper changing area. A handwashing sink used after diapering and toileting may not be used for food preparation.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Hot water temperature in classroom hand sinks exceeded 120 degrees. Hot water temperature must be 120 or below.

Corrections to be Made:

Program must lower the hot water temperature so it does not exceed 120 degrees and verification must be sent to OLA.

Corrections Made:

The program submitted photo verification that the water temperature had been lowered to not exceed 120 degrees.

Compliance Plan Action #2

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:44

All toxic or hazardous substances must be:

- (1) Inaccessible to children;
- (2) Used according to manufacturer's instructions;
- (3) Stored in the original or other labeled container; and
- (4) Disposed of according to manufacturer recommendations.

Bio-contaminants must be handled and disposed of properly.

Soiled diapers must be changed promptly, in a designated area, on a non-porous surface. The diaper changing area must be clean and disinfected with a sanitizing solution approved by the department. Soiled diapers must be kept in a leakproof, nonabsorbent container that is covered with a tight-fitting lid.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Cleaning closet in the main entrance was open and chemicals were accessible to children. Door does not have a latch to make chemicals inaccessible to children. All chemicals must be stored out of the reach of children.

Program was not using a bleach solution to sanitize. Changing areas must be clean and disinfected with a bleach sanitizing solution.

Corrections to be Made:

Program must move chemicals or install a latch on the closet so children do not have access to chemicals. Verification must be sent to OLA.

Program replaced the sanitizing bleach solution during the inspection, and it was approved by the inspector.

Corrections Made:

Program replaced the latch on the closet to the chemicals and a picture was submitted to OLA.

Program replaced the sanitizing bleach solution during the inspection, and it was approved by the inspector.

Compliance Plan Action #3

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:32

All walls, ceilings, floors, and equipment must be easily cleanable, kept clean, and in good repair. Heating and cooling

systems must maintain a temperature between sixty-five degrees Fahrenheit and seventy-five degrees Fahrenheit. For a child care center and school-age program, all heating and cooling systems must be inspected annually, by a certified technician.

Food preparation areas, including tables and countertops, must be made of a smooth, nonporous material, kept clean and sanitized, be free of cracks, and be in good repair. Center and school-age programs, in which more than twenty children are cared for, must provide a ventilation hood over all cooking areas. The hood must be appropriate for the type of appliance and intended use, as required in § 61:15:01:01.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Program did not have verification that the heating and cooling unit had been inspected. The heating and cooling unit must be inspected on an annual basis.

The slide in the Safari room is loose and needs to be secured to the wall, it also needs to be painted so that it is easily cleanable. All equipment must be cleanable and in good repair.

Corrections to be Made:

The heating and cooling unit must be inspected and a copy of the inspection must be submitted to OLA.

The slide must be braced to the wall and painted. Verification must be sent to OLA.

Corrections Made:

The program submitted a copy of the current heating and cooling inspection conducted in June 2025.

The program submitted a photo to OLA confirming the slide had been repaired, is braced to the wall, and painted.

Compliance Plan Action #4

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:31

An infant shall be fed according to the infant's schedule. The provider shall hold the infant's bottle when feeding the infant. The provider may not feed an infant by propping up the infant's bottle.

Food, including breast milk and formula, must be properly stored, kept at the proper temperature, and protected from potential contamination according to the preparing, feeding, and storing standards contained in **Caring for Our Children: National Health and Safety Performance Standards, 4th Edition.**

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Clean milk pitchers were stored on the same shelf as cleaning chemicals. Food and containers must be properly stored from potential contamination.

The temperature of the refrigerator in the infant room was 43 degrees. The temperature of the kitchen refrigerator was 46 degrees. The refrigerator temperature can not exceed 41 degrees.

Corrections to be Made:

Milk containers or cleaning materials must be separated from each other and verification must be sent to OLA.

Refrigerator temperatures must be lowered and verification must be sent to OLA.

Corrections Made:

Verification was sent in that the milk container had been separated from the cleaning materials.


