Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

During a complaint investigation conducted by the Office of Licensing & Accreditation, it was confirmed that a child under one year of age was allowed to sleep in a bouncy seat, which is not an approved sleep practice under *Caring for Our Children: National Health and Safety Performance Standards*.

Corrections to be Made:

The provider will take training in the topic area of the prevention of sudden infant death syndrome and the use of safe sleep practices.

Program administration will monitor the infant room to ensure safe sleep requirements are maintained at all times.

Corrections Made:

The program provided a copy of the certificate of completion for the Sleep Ambassador training.

During a complaint investigation conducted by the Office of Licensing & Accreditation, it was confirmed that a child under one year of age was left unsupervised in the classroom while sleeping.

The provider involved in the incident will take an active supervision training. Program administration will provide oversight to the provider to ensure children in care are supervised at all times.

The provider submitted the Active Supervision certificate to the Office of Licensing and Accreditation.




