The items listed below are those that the provider was not in compliance with at the time of the inspection.

Compliance Plan Action #1

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:37

Center and school-age programs operating outside of a school building shall follow applicable construction and fire safety requirements, as outlined in chapters 61:15:05 and 61:15:06. School-age programs operating in a school building shall follow applicable construction and fire safety requirements, as outlined in chapters 61:15:01, 61:15:02, and 61:15:07.

A family day care home must have the following fire safety measures in place:

- (1) A working smoke detector must be located on each level of the home;
- (2) A fully charged, portable fire extinguisher, with a minimum 2A rating, as identified on the extinguisher label, must be kept in or within fifteen feet of the kitchen or food preparation area;
- (3) A carbon monoxide detector must be installed, according to the manufacturer's instructions, if a fuel burning appliance is present in the home;
- (4) Each level of the home must have at least two remote exits that shall remain clear of obstructions. One of these exits must be a standard-sized door, and the other may be either a standard-sized door or an unobstructed, operable window, having at least five square feet of openable space, with a minimum width of twenty inches and a minimum height of twenty-four inches; and
- (5) Whenever a portable space heater, a wood burning stove, or a fireplace is in use, the heater, stove, or fireplace must be inaccessible to children.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Documentation of fire alarm system and sprinkler system inspection was not available during the inspection.

Corrections to be Made:

Fire alarm systems and
sprinkler system
should be inspected annually
and documentation should be available to review.

Corrections Made:

Documentation of fire alarm system and sprinkler system inspections were sent to OLA to review.

Compliance Plan Action #2**Administrative Rule:**

67:42:17:39

For family day care providers, unused electrical outlets must have an outlet plug cover, have a tamper-resistant cover, or be made inaccessible to a child.

For center and school-age programs, unused electrical outlets must have a self-closing outlet cover or tamper-resistant cover.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Electrical outlets under the large mirror in the dance room, on the far left side, were found open. The outlets are designed to be self-closing, but are not functioning properly.

Corrections to be Made:

For center programs, unused electrical outlets must have a self-closing outlet cover or tamper-resistant cover.

Corrections Made:

Electrical outlets under the large mirror in the dance room were replaced to be self-closing.

Compliance Plan Action #3**Administrative Rule:**

67:42:17:26

A nap mat, blanket, or other sleep surface, other than the floor, for children over one year of age must be available for each child during nap time.

A sleep surface must be maintained in good repair.

A provider shall follow the safe sleep practices contained in **Caring for Our Children: National Health and Safety Performance Standards, 4th Edition**, for infants under the age of one.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Infant in the nursery room was observed asleep with a blanket and another blanket on top of the mattress.

Corrections to be Made:

Providers shall follow the safe sleep practices contained in Caring for Our Children: National Health and Safety Performance Standards, 4th Edition, for infants under the age of one. This includes keeping loose bedding, like blankets, out of the infant's sleep area.

Corrections Made:

The blanket was removed from the infant's sleeping area and the infant woke up during the inspection. Program administration will review all safe sleep practices were reviewed with all infant classroom providers. The OLA (Office of Licensing and Accreditation) has issued a Corrective Action Plan with the program to continue to monitor compliance.

Compliance Plan Action #4**Administrative Rule:**

67:42:17:44

All toxic or hazardous substances must be:

- (1) Inaccessible to children;
- (2) Used according to manufacturer's instructions;
- (3) Stored in the original or other labeled container; and
- (4) Disposed of according to manufacturer recommendations.

Bio-contaminants must be handled and disposed of properly.

Soiled diapers must be changed promptly, in a designated area, on a non-porous surface. The diaper changing area must be clean and disinfected with a sanitizing solution approved by the department. Soiled diapers must be kept in a leakproof, nonabsorbent container that is covered with a tight-fitting lid.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Garbage used to dispose of soiled diapers was observed without a lid in one classroom.

Corrections to be Made:

Soiled diapers must be kept in a leakproof, nonabsorbent container that is covered with a tight-fitting lid.

Corrections Made:

The lid was placed on the garbage can. Program administration reminded all providers to make sure the lid is on the garbage can at all times.

Compliance Plan Action #5

Administrative Rule:

67:42:17:32

All walls, ceilings, floors, and equipment must be easily cleanable, kept clean, and in good repair. Heating and cooling systems must maintain a temperature between sixty-five degrees Fahrenheit and seventy-five degrees Fahrenheit. For a child care center and school-age program, all heating and cooling systems must be inspected annually, by a certified technician.

Food preparation areas, including tables and countertops, must be made of a smooth, nonporous material, kept clean and sanitized, be free of cracks, and be in good repair. Center and school-age programs, in which more than twenty children are cared for, must provide a ventilation hood over all cooking areas. The hood must be appropriate for the type of appliance and intended use, as required in § 61:15:01:01.

Summary of Non-Compliance Finding:

Documentation for heating and cooling inspection was not available during inspection. Structural support columns in a room were observed to have chipped paint.

Corrections to be Made:

Heating and cooling systems should be inspected annually and documentation should be available for review. All walls, ceilings, floors, and equipment must be easily cleanable, kept clean, and in good repair.

Corrections Made:

Documentation for heating and cooling inspection was sent to OLA to review. Structural support columns in a room were repainted.
